Originally from Livingston, Montana, Don received his bachelor of arts in business administration from UM. He continued his education and obtained an MBA from Wharton School of Finance and Commerce at the University of Pennsylvania.

After working in San Francisco for a couple of years, Don wanted a change and returned to Montana. He decided to develop the t-shirt business he started in college. Excited to grow his business, Don took on the t-shirt industry and expanded into a retail clothing store, Shirtworks, in Bozeman. As if owning one business wasn't challenging enough, Don started a second endeavor, a wholesale screen printing business, Wildwest Shirt Company.
